## President's Message

We've finally got some good news from our attorneys. For the first time in over 18 months; we do not have any legal actions against us. This has been tough. We have not been able to say anything for fear of giving our opponents ammunition in the actions. We also were spending a lot of money trying to protect our community. To explain: these were not court trials; they were actions taken by the state based on claims that WJV was discriminating against people with disabilities.

The good news is we prevailed---we were judged innocent. Now we can move on to more positive activities.

We have some big projects facing us in 2017; all of them involving big \$\$\$\$\$. Fortunately, we have enough money in our reserves to cover them. The areas needing attention are: the roads, the front gate and the perimeter fence.

We have enough funds in our reserves but it is not distributed in all the right accounts. We will need to move some of these funds around to make sure they are in the right places to cover these expenses.

The BOD cannot arbitrarily move money from one area to another. We need approval from the WJV membership to do this.

As a result of this, we will place a resolution on this year's ballot to approve the transfer of reserves from some areas that have too much money to those that are short.

We will prepare a detail explanation of this in the next month. This will be critical for us to have adequate funds to cover the three areas where we will need to spend money.

## Financial Report

September cash balance is down to \$44.8K and Reserve balances are up at \$769K. We are over budget by the amount of our Legal expense.

The budget for 2017 is now in place and our monthly fees will rise to \$115 per month. Hopefully this will be enough to give a balanced budget for the year.

Please join us for our first meeting of the season at 4pm in the clubhouse. The selection is the *Ape House* by Sara Gruen.

"Sam, Bonzi, Lola, Mbongo, Jelani, and Makena are no ordinary apes. These bonobos are capable of reason and carrying on deep relationships—but unlike most bonobos, they also know American Sign Language.

Isabel Duncan, a scientist at the Great Ape Language Lab, doesn't understand people, but animals she gets—especially the bonobos.

Isabel feels more comfortable in their world than she's ever felt among humans . . . until she meets John Thigpen, who braves the ever-present animal rights protesters outside the lab to see what's really going on inside.

When an explosion rocks the lab, severely injuring Isabel and "liberating" the apes, John's human interest piece turns into the story of a lifetime. Then a reality TV show featuring the missing apes debuts under mysterious circumstances, and it immediately becomes the biggest—and unlikeliest—phenomenon in the history of modern media.

Millions of fans are glued to their screens watching the apes. Now, to save her family of apes from this parody of human life, Isabel must connect with her own kind.
