Lake Rules

- There is no swimming in the lake.
- The lake is a catch and release for fishing.
- No motorized boat is permitted.

Lawn Mowing: Weekly during the summer months and Bi-weekly during the late fall and winter months. Mowing is usually done on Thursdays. Please do not water your lawn during the hours immediately prior to the mowing day. If the lawn is too wet during periods of heavy rain, it may be left until it has dried out to a point that the mowers can mow safely.

Lawn Edging & Trimming along Landscape: This is a service provided by the lawn company. You are responsible to prune shrubs and pull weeds in landscaped areas around your home.

Palm Trimming: Provide once yearly during early spring. If additional trimming is needed, it is your responsibility at your expense.

Fruit Trees: Beautiful to look at. Fruit is wonderful to eat. **Please pick up** any fruit on the ground.

Save Aluminum Cans: You may bring them to the clubhouse & put them in the marked containers. Please make sure to rinse the cans out to avoid bugs. Recycle money is added to the Activities Committee to help fund WJV Activities.

<u>Garbage Pick Up</u>: On Monday and Thursday mornings, Waste Management will pick up your garbage. Containers may be placed on the sidewalk, close to the grass after 6:00 PM the evening prior. Once emptied, please remove containers from the sidewalks as soon as possible.

Recycling: On **Monday** morning, items such as plastic food containers, glass bottles and jars, steel cans, cardboard and food packaging material will be picked up from the container (yellow lid) provided. Rinse all containers that held food or liquid. (See page 9 for details)

Yard Waste: On **Monday** morning waste material will be picked up. Such material must be paper bagged or <u>tied into bundles no longer than 4 ft. in length.</u>

One person must be able to lift them. Separate cans provided by the residents or bags designed for this purpose are acceptable.

<u>Trash Removal</u>: Furniture, appliances, etc. will be picked up on **Monday** morning. Please call Waste Management at 239-213-4700 to make arrangements or for any questions.

Storage Compound Key: Keys for the gate are available for a deposit of \$100.00 from Harry Wilson with a completed registration form. The deposit will be refunded when you are no longer using the space and you return the key.

Please read posted sign regarding liability. Everything must be licensed and registered. See Harry Wilson for an assigned spot.

Keys for the Walk-in Gate: Contact Harry Wilson for a key for the gate.

Tennis and Pickle Ball Courts: Available to residents and guests.

Bocce Ball Courts: Available to residents and guests when not in use by Windjammer teams.

Shuffleboard Courts: Available to residents and guests when not in use by Windjammer teams.

Equipment for Bocce Ball and Shuffleboard: Equipment is stored in the shed near the courts. Please return it to the proper place when you have finished.

Entrance Gate Instructions:

Residents may purchase a gate opener from Harry Wilson. This is your access to the park. However, you should receive the gate opener from the previous owner if you are a new resident.

Visitors: Your visitors need to use the keypad on the phone at the gate area in order to enter the park. They will need to know your house number and press the numbers slowly, then press the call button. If the house # is only 2 digits then you need to add a 0 in front of it. The phone will ring at the resident's phone and they will open the gate for the visitor or delivery man.

Residents: After speaking to the visitor at the gate and you wish to admit the visitor, **push "9"** on your telephone key pad and the gate will open. In order for this to work, you MUST give your telephone number (house or cell) to Resort Management in order that it may be programmed into the computer gate system. You do not have to have a "239" area code phone number.

Your phone number is needed by Resort Management for anyone to gain access to the community; however, if you do not want your telephone number published in the park phone directory, notify Resort Management.

New Residents: From the seller, you should receive the Windjammer Village Prospectus (this belongs to the unit, not the homeowner) and a phone directory or the phone directory may be obtained and printed from the Windjammer Village Website.

<u>Pets</u>: Pets are welcome in Windjammer Village, two pets per household. ALL cats and/or dogs MUST be on a leash when outside your home. KEEP OFF the lawns of other park residents when walking your pet. PLEASE USE A "POOPER SCOOPER"

Pool Rules:

Please read the entire posted rules at the pool. See below for a summary.

- Pool hours are 7:00 AM until 11:00 PM
- Persons under 16 MUST be accompanied by an adult.
- **SHOWER** before entering the pool or spa. Body oils, hair, etc. collect in the pump filters causing extra expense for pool maintenance.
- No cut offs in the pool. Swim wear only.
- Infants **MUST** wear "swim wear" diapers.
- No toys or rafts allowed. "Noodles" are allowed and some are provided. Please leave them in the provided container when finished.
- Place towel on pool furniture when wearing tanning lotion or sunscreen.
- Please put Pool furniture back where you found it after using it.

Parking:

- No overnight parking on streets.
- No boats, trailers, etc. stored on carport.
- No non-operative vehicles may be parked on carport.
- Parking in clubhouse area is reserved for activities until. If you must park a
 vehicle in that area overnight; please be certain that there is no activity
 scheduled before parking overnight earlier and park in lot closest to the
 gate.

Driver Licenses

Division of Motor Vehicles 725 Airport Road South

Information: 239-434-4600 Hours: 8-5 Mon.-Fri.

(No appointments needed except for motorcycles).

When: If you own a vehicle, you must register it within 10 working days of becoming a Florida resident. You then have 10 days to acquire your Florida driver license. If you don't own a vehicle, you must first sign an affidavit attesting to that before getting your Florida driver license.

Documents Needed: Current registration, old driver's license and social security card and proof of Insurance. When becoming a Florida resident, you must register your vehicle within thirty (30) days.

Note: An eye test may be performed before Florida driver license is issued.

Other Outdoor Uses:

Car and boat washing. Nonporous surfaces, sidewalks, driveways, exterior home surfaces and roofs are your responsibility. They are allowed any time with use of

low-volume pressure cleaning equipment and/or water hose. Water hose shall be equipped with an automatic self-canceling or closing nozzle.

Note: Backflow preventers are <u>required</u> by Florida State on all outside water faucets.

Collier County Recycling

Collier County's recycling program involves both commercial and residential participation. Items collected for recycling include:

Newspapers: Place dry newspapers in the recycle bin.

Cans: Rinse tin, steel or aluminum cans before placing them in the recycle bin. You do not have to remove labels. Do not place any scrap metal or such items as aluminum foil or pie pans in the bin.

Plastics #1 and #2: Look on the bottom of the container for the #1 or #2 symbols. Do not add plastic bags or oversized containers to the bin. These plastic items include most soft drink bottles, milk and water bottles, cooking oil containers and some detergent bottles.

Glass: Clear, green and brown glass bottles and jars can be recycled. Rinse them and place in the bin. Do not place light bulbs, drinking glasses, plate glass, mirrors, clay flower pots, oven ware, crystal or ceramics in the bin.

Cardboard: Do not place cardboard in the recycle bin. Contact the Solid Waste Dept. at 743-2507 for information about recycling cardboard. Cardboard may be dropped off at the county's Transfer Stations.

Telephone Books: Recycle telephone books at the county's transfer stations.

Scrap Metal: Call the Solid Waste Dept. at 239-732-2507 for information.

Yard Waste: Place yard waste in clear plastic bags or in containers weighing less than 50 pounds or place them in bundles no longer than 4 feet. Keep garbage and other trash separate from yard waste.

Used Motor Oil: Recycle used motor oil at the county's transfer stations. Also, check with area automotive parts stores and some department stores for recycling motor oil.

Antifreeze: Drop antifreeze off at the hazardous waste center at the Naples landfill or at the transfer stations.

Tires: Place tires at the curb and call Waste Management at 239-649-2212 for pick up. Businesses must take their tires to the landfill.

That Virginia Gould moved into Unit 170 in October 1985 and was the first home owner in the village?


That the unusual numbering system used for our addresses was dictated by Collier County?

HELPFUL HINTS FOR HOMEOWNERS LEAVING FOR EXTENDED PERIODS OF TIME

If you are leaving Windjammer Village for an extended period of time, this is a good checklist to go through in your home before leaving.

- 1. Clean home thoroughly. Be sure toaster, microwave, etc. is clean. Do not leave any "crumbs" for the bugs to enjoy. Empty vacuum bag.
- 2. Do not leave any items outdoors or on screened lanai's that may blow around in the event of heavy winds.
- **3.** Place saran wrap over toilets after cleaning to prevent water evaporation.
- **4.** Thoroughly clean dishwasher and garbage disposal. Leave dishwasher open slightly.
- **5.** Shut off electricity to water heater at the circuit breaker and wall switch.
- **6.** Shut off electricity to stove, washer and dryer. This can be done at the circuit breaker. **DO NOT SHUT OFF POWER TO THE HOUSE**. **Outdoor lamp post lighting is mandatory.**
- **7.** Set refrigerator on "vacation" or on lowest setting. If possible, fill containers of water and place in freezer and refrigerator. This helps save electricity, as once cool, they stay cool.
- **8.** Dispose of perishable food from cupboards or refrigerator. St. Mathew's House accepts them.
- **9.** Place roach and ant control products around exterior and interior of house.
- **10.** Set humidistat and air conditioner as recommended by Florida Power and Light Company.
- 11. Leave interior doors open for circulation.
- **12.** Shut off water to INSIDE HOME at outside main valve outside behind your home.
- **13.** Check light in lamppost. Arrange to have it checked during your absence. Leave additional light bulbs with your care taker.
- **14.** If you wish to leave your lawn sprinklers on...install a rain sensor to eliminate wasting water.
- **15.** Contact telephone, electric, water, cable companies, etc. with new updates for your billing address.

- **16.** Notify TV, Telephone and Internet provider companies if you wish your service to be put on vacation rate.
- **17.** Notify any newspaper of your stop date.
- **18.** Fill out change of address form with post office and Resort Management.
- **19.** Arrange to have your home checked on regularly. Resort Management should be told who you caretaker is and how to contact them.
- **20.** Leave a key with a neighbor or person checking home for use in an emergency. Make certain the Resort Management has this information.
- **21.** Take necessary steps to prevent insect infestation such as termites. Termite inspections should be done annually.
- **22.** Unplug TV's or other electronic items to prevent damage from lightening.
- **23.** Check your insurance coverage- keep it up to date.
- **24.** Place "dry" groceries in air tight containers to prevent ants and bugs. The refrigerator is a good storage area.
- **25.** Carports must be emptied of all loose items.
- **26.** Replace batteries in Smoke Alarms and place a new light bulb in your coach lights prior to leaving for the season.

Drive safely and enjoy your summer! We look forward to your return!

REMINDER:

Many of you will be heading north sometime soon. Please make sure you remove all outside items from around your home.

(Lawn furniture, grills, bikes, garden decorations, wind chimes, hoses, garbage cans, recycle bins, etc.)

Storms and possible hurricane winds make these items "possible missiles" that can damage your home or your neighbors' home.
